Infrastructure

- High-contrast markings of steps and obstacles

- Shuttle/accompaniment to the camp

Remaining barriers

- Difficult to recognise obstacles such as tent ropes or pegs
- No tactile guidance systems at the camp
- Little to no information in Braille
- Getting there: Long journey (approx. 1km) from a low-barrier public transport stop to the camp
